2025 Orienteering Season Is About to Begin!

Orienteering is the sport of land navigation. It began in Sweden and has spread around the world. A course is laid out, participants use map reading skills, and a compass to locate checkpoints marked on the map, and return to the finish line in the shortest amount of time. While some



participants are competitive and may run the course, many of us from New Sweden simply enjoy a nature walk while improving our map and compass skills.

New Sweden participates in the Columbia River Orienteering Club (CROC) events. There are usually four different distances and skill levels, so beginners and experienced participants can all enjoy the event. The course can be completed as a group or individually. Following the event participants usually gather to celebrate their accomplishments and socialize.

On Sunday, May 18th, New Sweden participants will join with those from the Swedish School and meet up at Hamilton Island. The trailhead is located on the Washington side of the Columbia Gorge near Bonneville Dam. It is a stunning location with the Cascade Mountains towering over the mighty Columbia River. Following the CROC event, likely around 2:00 pm, folks will gather at a nearby picnic area, enjoy a hosted BBQ picnic and play Kubb. New Sweden members are invited to come and enjoy the picnic even if they have not participated in the orienteering event. New Sweden will reimburse event participants for their registration fee when course completed documents are submitted.

In the last newsletter, we read an excerpt of Jimmy Granström's article "Forging a post-industrial future in Sweden's "pleasure garden" How new industries, movies and music have given Mälardalen a much-needed confidence boost in recent years". In this newsletter, we will get to learn a bit more about the town Eskilstuna in Sörmland.

The Sheffield of Sweden

Sörmland's long industrial history dates back to the 16th century and is clearly showcased with the statue "Smederna (The Blacksmiths)" which can be seen on the main square Fristadstorget in Sörmland's biggest town Eskilstuna. Its history dates back to medieval times when English monk Saint Eskil made "Tuna" his base and diocese of the south coast of Lake Mälaren. Saint Eskil was stoned to death by the pagan vikings of the neighboring town Strängnäs, 30 kilometers (19 miles) east of Eskilstuna, when he tried to convert them to Christianity. Eventually Tuna merged with the trading place Fors on the other side of Eskilstuna River, forming the town Tunafors.

The first steps towards Eskilstuna's industrial boom was taken in the 16th century by Duke Carl (later King Karl IX), the only son of Gustav Vasa to have inherited his father's interest in the iron industry. He appreciated the value of his mines, paddling furnaces, and foundries, continuing his father's work while developing his iron companies. One of his inherited commitments was a collection of smithies, each over a century old, in Tunafors. Here, Duke Carl found all the supplies that he needed to manufacture iron products on a large scale. At the end of the 16th century, he opened workshops in this little community to manufacture nails, which were in high demand in vast quantities in those days. Soon, weapons – such as halberds, pistols, and muskets – also became some of Tunafors' staple products. The name Tunafors was changed to Eskilstuna in 1739, and the city grew enormously during the Industrial Revolution and became one of the most important industrial cities of Sweden, earning the nickname "Stålstaden ("The City Of Steel"). Aside from firearms, the city also produced superior carpentry and wood carving chisels, cutlery, scissors, keys, machine tools and precision instruments. As a tribute to the steel industry, the figure of a steel worker is included in the city's coat of arms. Eskilstuna is sometimes called "The Sheffield of Sweden". At their peaks, both cities were home to numerous steel production companies.
